1	did you	did'ja	<p><u>Did you</u> just make that? = Did'ja just make that?</p> <p><u>Did you</u> ring? = Did'ja ring?</p> <p><u>Did you</u> really think you could get away with this? = Did'ja really think you could get away with this?</p>
2	would you	would'ju OR would'ja	<p><u>Would you</u> like to see it? = Would'ju like to see it?</p> <p><u>Would you</u> like to sit and stare at the fake fire? = Would'ju like to sit and stare at the fake fire?</p> <p><u>Would you</u> repeat it? = Would'ju repeat it?</p>
3	let you	let'chu OR let'cha	<p>I can't <u>let you</u> in at the moment. = I can't let'chu in at the moment.</p> <p>They <u>let you</u> get away with that? = They let'chu get away with that?</p> <p>I wish I could <u>let you</u> just live in your fantasy world. = I wish I could let'chu just live in your fantasy world.</p>
4	what you	what'chu OR what'cha	<p><u>What you</u> want? = What'chu want?</p> <p>Get treated like a dumb animal long enough, that's <u>what you</u> become. = Get treated like a dumb animal long enough, that's what'chu become.</p> <p>See <u>what you</u> are praying for. = See what'chu are praying for.</p>
5	"T"	"D"	<p><u>Great</u> idea! = Gread idea!</p> <p><u>What a beautiful</u> day today! = Whad a beaudiful day today!</p> <p>Did you <u>invite</u> that kid to your <u>party</u>? = Did you invide that kid to your pardy?</p>

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6	“t” (between “n” and “e”)	silent (بی صدا)	Our <u>printer</u> shut down. = Our prin’er shut down. And welcome to the Investor’s <u>Center</u> . = And welcome to the Investor’s cen’er . Now, for your halftime <u>entertainment</u> = Now, for your halftime en’ertainment This <u>Internet</u> stock bullshit? = This In’ernet stock bullshit?
7	have to	hafta	I <u>have to</u> go. = I hafta go. But they don’t <u>have to</u> operate. = But they don’t hafta operate. I <u>have to</u> get back, Holmes. = I hafta get back, Holmes.
8	has to	hasta	She says she <u>has to</u> speak to you. = She says she hasta speak to you. and it <u>has to</u> be researched. = and it hasta be researched. Green <u>has to</u> open up the books... = Green hasta open up the books...
9	ought to	oughda	I think I <u>ought to</u> fess up. = I think I oughda fess up. I mean, I <u>ought to</u> do it. = I mean, I oughda do it. I <u>ought to</u> kill you. = I oughda kill you.
10	“to”	ta	How much will it cost <u>to</u> make you forget you walked in here? = How much will it cost ta make you forget you walked in here? I’d like to take a moment <u>to</u> welcome you all back. = I’d like ta take a moment ta welcome you all back. Ma’am, walk <u>to</u> the rear of the car. = Ma’am, walk ta the rear of the car.

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11	"to"	da	Well, I try <u>to</u> be a sensible dad. = Well, I try da be a sensible dad. Do you know how <u>to</u> do that? = Do you know how da do that? I need <u>to</u> go <u>to</u> my office. = I need da go da my office.
12	you	ya	Scotty, can <u>you</u> do it? = Scotty, can ya do it? What do <u>you</u> mean? = What do ya mean? How can <u>you</u> tell? = How can ya tell?
13	your/ you're	yer	Is that <u>your</u> house? = Is that yer house? <u>You're</u> done? = Yer done? Where's <u>your</u> car, Dude? = Where's yer car, Dude?
14	yours	yers	Are they <u>yours</u> ? = Are they yers ? You're right, <u>yours</u> is worse. = You're right, yers is worse. <u>Yours</u> is the one with the icing clip. = Yers is the one with the icing clip.
15	and	'n OR an'	We are very much alike, you and I. = We are very much alike, you 'n I. <u>And</u> I know you know what I want. = An' I know you know what I want. Well, I think you should probably get in your car <u>and</u> drive as fast as you can. = Well, I think you should probably get in your car 'n drive as fast as you can.

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
